On Monday, November 25 delegates from several local historical groups will meet with the Upper Dublin Historic Preservation Commission to share ideas about the future of Lindenwold Estate. As mentioned previously, the estate is in the process of being sold and having its zoning reviewed. The castle and estate are an important part of the story of Ambler and would be a crucial part of any historic district based on the Keasbey and Mattison company.
