Positive progress is being made on the house on Skippack Pike near the Pennlyn-

The historic house across from Dawesfield was demolished this past year and has been replaced with a large modern house. The well house (draped on the right) was integrated into the design, but the original stone is being replaced with new decorative stone from Oley, near Lancaster.

Around the corner from the Schoolhouse, there has been a lovely wooded lot facing a row of three houses which were originally built by the Randall family (who started Mermaid Lake) for their daughters. Over the years each of the

three houses has been individualized by its owner. When the



wooded lot went up for sale, it looked like one large house would be build. Due to smart planning, two smaller homes with many of the trees left will complement School Road's existing atmosphere. Check out also the care being taken by the new owners of house across School Road from our site.





Ambler Boiler House - Adaptive Reuse from "Ambler - Hometown News"

The Ambler Boiler House has completed its impressive transformation, from abandoned Brownfield site, to a clean, green and LEED-Platinum-certified state of the art office space and transit oriented development. The location of the project is considered ideal because of its proximity to the SEPTA rail station and to existing roadways and available utility services.

The first tenant has already taken occupancy in the building with additional tenants to follow through the first half of 2013.
