

From the President's Desk by Russ Bellavance

People often think of historical societies as resistant to change because they want to preserve the past. But the purpose of studying history is to understand change over a period of time - especially evolutionary change. Historical societies themselves are not exempt from the need to change and evolve. The Wissahickon Valley Historical Society is in the midst of change right now - as we work to find ways to appeal to the rising generation of local residents.

One of these changes is evident in our most recent newsletter which is the first of our new quarterly newsletters. Newsletters have always served many functions, and we have come to understand that some of these functions are better served through electronic means rather than through a monthly newsletter.
