

BOXWOOD

"The Boxwood" at 1098 Skippack Pike (at the corner with Cathcart Road) houses the office of our Pennsylvania Representative Liz Hanbidge. This charming 19th-century Federal-style house with its white barn used to be part of a 50-acre property, Boxwood Farm, created by the Woods family. In Colonial America, wealthy homeowners styled their yards with boxwood hedges in a formal design. In this case, many boxwood shrubs were planted near the house, giving the property its name.


The original section of the structure, built around 1730, later had two additions. Today the house is three stories high with extended eaves (overhangs from the roof). The two large front windows may have been French doors, now filled in at the bottom.

The Whitpain group held its had their desks, and they used the second floor for their office, library and museum. The second floor is used today only by the township for their storage.

The Historical Society of Whitpain combined with the Wissahickon Valley Historical Society in 2015. With the merger, the Whitpain group's local history collection became available at the WVHS museum at the 1895 Public School.
